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# SAFE ZONES

## LOGLINE

As climate change renders entire regions uninhabitable, a limited number of protected territories emerge as habitable sanctuaries. Access to these Safe Zones is regulated through climate visas, redefining borders, citizenship, and the right to exist. When survival depends on authorization rather than nationality, the world enters a new geopolitical order where living somewhere becomes a privilege — not a right.

## TONE & DNA

*Safe Zones* operates in a grounded, human-centered register, combining the near-future plausibility of **Years and Years**, the moral urgency of **Children of Men**, and the systemic tension of **The Handmaid's Tale** stripped of ideology.

The tone is tense but restrained, rooted in administrative decisions, border protocols, and bureaucratic violence rather than spectacle. Dialogue is procedural, emotionally compressed, often framed through interviews, assessments, and eligibility reviews. Violence is structural: exclusion, delay, and denial. The threat is not chaos, but **selection**.

## VISION

*Safe Zones* explores a radical redefinition of sovereignty: when geography becomes destiny again. As habitable land shrinks, states no longer govern citizens — they manage access. The series examines how climate crisis transforms borders into filters, humanitarian language into policy tools, and survival into a negotiable asset.

## CORE MYTHOLOGY / SOCLE NARRATIF

Safe Zones are territorially protected regions where climate conditions remain stable enough to sustain long-term life. They are secured through massive investment, technological shielding, and international agreements.

Entry is regulated through climate visas based on:

- origin zone viability
- economic contribution
- health metrics
- strategic usefulness

Citizenship no longer guarantees residence. Residence no longer guarantees permanence. Outside the Zones, populations are tolerated — temporarily.

The system is presented as humanitarian. It functions as **geographical selection**.

## SERIES DYNAMICS

The narrative unfolds across multiple layers: border administrations, relocation councils, diplomatic negotiations, and families navigating eligibility processes. Each character occupies a different position in the system — decision-maker, applicant, enforcer, or surplus population.

Conflict arises from incompatible timelines: political stability versus human urgency. Characters must choose between enforcing a system that preserves order, or challenging one that quietly decides who is allowed to live where.

## SEASON 1 — NARRATIVE ARC

Season 1 follows the consolidation of the Safe Zone system:

- Declaration of uninhabitable regions
- Establishment of climate visas as emergency measures
- Escalation of demand and tightening of criteria
- Emergence of black-market access and unofficial corridors
- Internal disputes within Safe Zone governance
- A breaking point where exclusion triggers unrest across zones

The season ends with a decisive shift: Safe Zones are no longer temporary responses — they become the **new global architecture**.

## WHY THIS SERIES / WHY NOW

As climate displacement accelerates and borders harden, *Safe Zones* reflects a future already forming. It asks a simple, unsettling question: when survival depends on location, who decides where life is allowed?

It is not a story about migration.  
It is a story about **permission to exist**.
